### THE HERBERT CROW MEMORIAL AWARD

*...honours achievement in transport scholarship, management systems, training, research, authorship and publication, or any other knowledge-enhancing transport activity.*

Founded by the Worshipful Company of Carmen in 2000 and now presented by the Carmen's Benevolent Trust. It comprises the Herbert Crow Memorial Cup, displayed in the Company offices, a silver gilt medal and framed citation, to be retained by the award recipient(s).
